

UNDERSTANDING YOUR BILL

A STEP-BY-STEP GUIDE

1 Date Bill Prepared/Next Meter Read:

Look here to find the date of our next meter reading. Please give our meter readers safe access to the meter each month.

2 Your Customer Account Number:

Please use this number when requesting information about your account or when paying your bill.

3 24-hr Customer Service Phone Number

4 Rate Schedule:

This identifies the SCE rate used to calculate your bill.

5 Rotating Outage Group:

This is the number of the circuit group to which your service account is assigned—refer to this number in the event of rotating outages to see if you are affected.

6 Billing Summary:

Shows the total amount that you owe. It includes your current charges, the total amount of your last billing statement and the date and amount of your last payment. Any balance remaining from your last billing statement is also shown here.

7 Current Charges:

Your bill is past due if payment is not received on or before this date.

8 Your Current Energy Usage:

Provides details on how much electricity you used during the current billing period. The identification number of the meter located at your home or business, the previous and current meter readings, and the date those readings took place is also shown here.

9 Meter Read:

You will see the words **Actual** or **Estimated** here, depending on whether or not the bill was calculated on an actual or estimated read. On the far right, you will see the total kilowatt-hours (kWh) of electricity you used during the billing period.

10 Usage Comparison:


Your current usage is compared against your usage during the same billing period last year and from two years ago. The "Average usage per day" is used to compare energy usage because the number of days in the billing period may be different from year to year.

11 Did You Know?:

Look here for important messages from SCE.

12 Payment Stub:

In this section you will see the amount due and a place to write your payment amount. Tear off this section and include it with your check in the return envelope provided with your bill.

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UNDERSTANDING YOUR BILL BY USAGE

13 By Usage:

This section displays the number of days in the current billing period and the season used for billing purposes. It also provides a summary of your delivery and generation charges.

14 Delivery Related Charges:

This section is a summary of your delivery related charges.

A This section is a compilation of the charges required for providing electric service, excluding generation. The charges include: Transmission and Distribution charges, Nuclear Decommissioning Charges, Public Purpose Program Charges, Public Utilities Commission Reimbursement Fee, Trust Transfer Amount, and DWR Bond. Charges for delivery apply to all metered usage.

15 Generation Related Charges:

This section is a summary of your generation related charges.

B These charges cover fees for the generation and procurement of electric energy.

16 Basic Charge:

This charge covers basic services such as bill preparation, meters, meter reading and customer billing.

17 DWR Bond Charge:

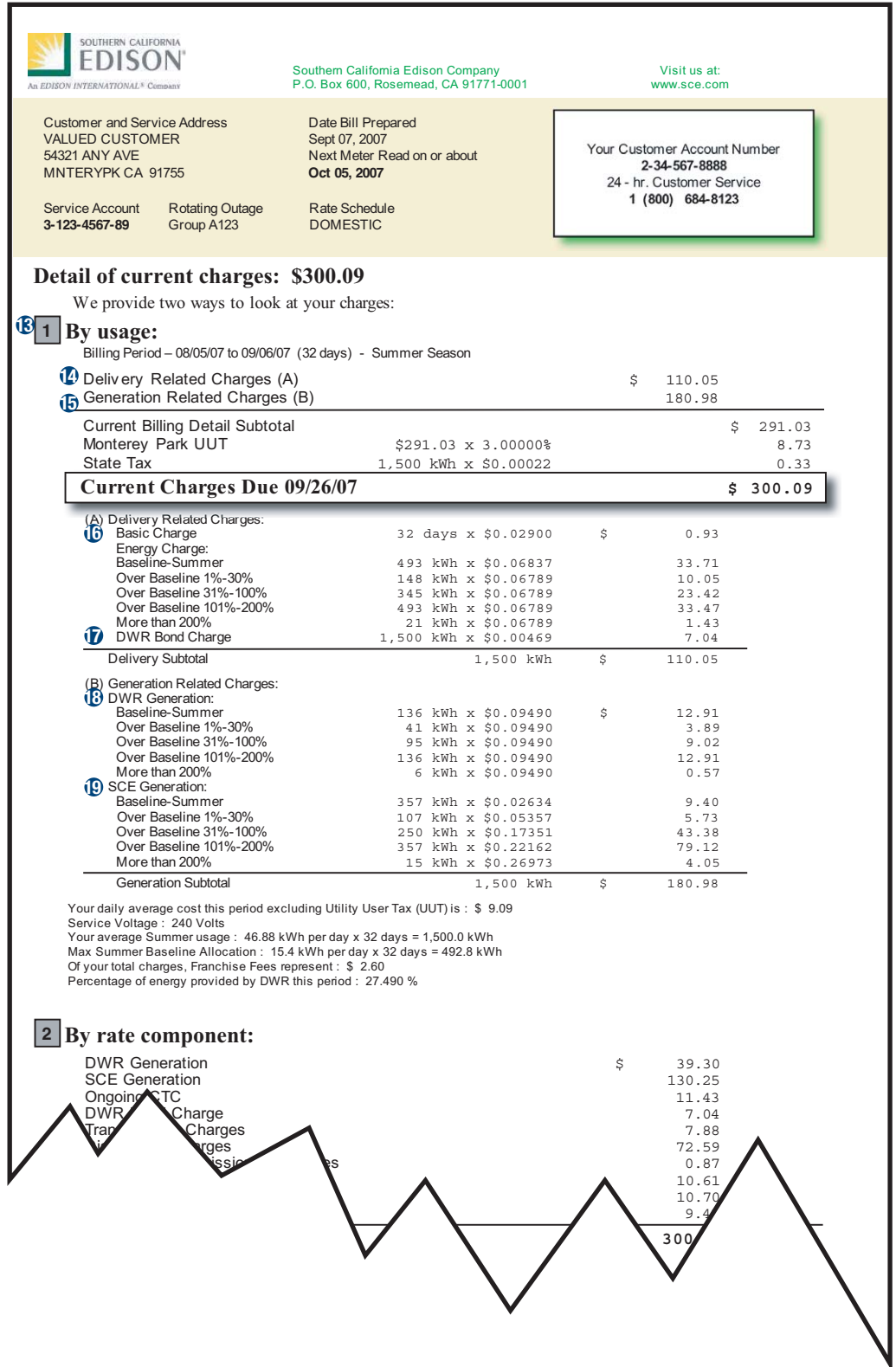
Bonds issued by the Department of Water Resources (DWR) to cover the cost of buying power for customers during the energy crisis are being repaid through a portion of your electric bill.

18 DWR Generation:

These charges include DWR Generation Charges for that portion of your energy usage provided by the Department of Water Resources and are being collected by SCE as an agent for DWR.

19 SCE Generation:

These charges reflect the amount included in your rate for recovery of energy procurement and generation costs for that portion of your energy provided by SCE. Effective September 20, 2001, your ability to enter into new contracts to purchase electricity from a supplier other than SCE was suspended by the CPUC. Those customers who were taking Direct Access service or who had signed a contract prior to September 20, 2001 are able to switch suppliers consistent with CPUC established rules.



UNDERSTANDING YOUR BILL

BY RATE COMPONENT

20 Baseline Allocation for Billing Period:

This shows the amount of electricity in kilowatt- hours allocated at the baseline rate. The baseline allocations were established by the CPUC in 1982, based upon geographic region, season and whether yours is an all-electric or combination of gas and electric home.

21 Transmission Charges:

Charges associated with transporting electricity over long distances, such as from generating stations to substations in your neighborhood.

22 Distribution Charges:

Charges associated with transporting electricity from your neighborhood substation to your home or business as well as customer services such as billing, metering, and telephone call centers.

23 Nuclear Decommissioning Charges:

CPUC-mandated charges to pay for dismantling SCE's nuclear power plants after they are retired from operation.

24 Public Purpose Program Charges:

This charge covers the cost for state-mandated programs, such as the California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE) discount and energy efficiency programs.

25 Trust Transfer Amount:

Reflects the Fixed Transmission Amount (FTA), chargeable to residential and small commercial customers pursuant to state law and a financing order issued by the CPUC. The Trust Transfer Amount is the property of SCE Funding Limited Liability Corporation (LLC) and is collected by SCE solely as a servicing agent of SCE Funding LLC.

26 Taxes and Other:

The sum of all charges resulting from the calculation of Public Utilities Commission Reimbursement Fee, city tax, state tax and any affiliate billing charges.
